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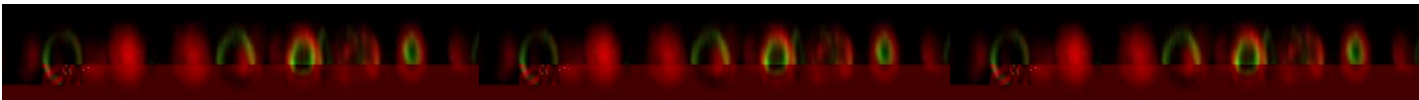

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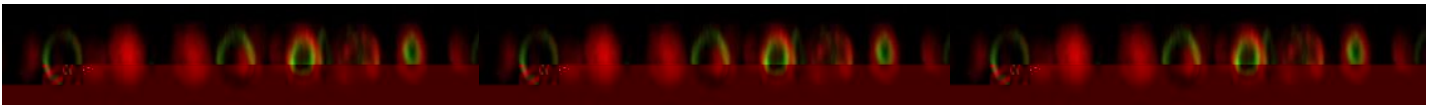
ETHICS

- a. Follow the current journal image preparation

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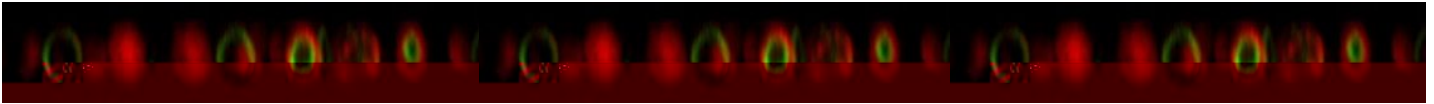
