On Wednesday, August 16th, a female Boston College student reported that a male subject had exposed himself to her while in the area of the Chestnut Hill Reservoir on several occasions since June. The latest incident took place on Tuesday, August 15th around 7:15 pm in the area of the walking path near Chestnut Hill Drive.

The student described the subject as being a white male, in his late 30's to early 40's, 5'9"-5'10", balding, with brown hair and a full-brown beard. The female was certain that the subject was the same individual from previous incidents.

Anyone with any information should contact the Massachusetts State Police or Boston College Police.

Community members should be vigilant while walking and/or jogging around surrounding areas during the day and night and take appropriate precautions. If you are out after dark, try to travel in groups, use only well-lit routes or designated pathways, and do not allow yourself to be distracted by phone calls or ear buds.
